Correct prepositions:

- 5) Mr Naylor is on holiday from now UNTIL the end of the month.
- 6) We require payment BY 2 August at the latest.

modals

English sentences:

conditional sentences

Examples of correct forms:

- 1) If we all worked sixty hours a week, we would increase our output.
- 2) I would fly to Australia if I had more money.
- 3) If you pay within ten days, you will receive a discount.
- 4) My boss would have been very angry if he had seen the mistake.
- 5) If the project had been completed on time, the customer would have been satisfied.

much / many / a lot of

Correct sentences:

- 1) There are not MANY items in the warehouse.
- 2) The new software costs A LOT OF money.
- 3) How MUCH hardware have you purchased so far?
- 4) He knows A LOT about SAP systems.
- 5) There are too MANY managers at my company.
- 6) We DON'T HAVE enough employees in the first level support team.

passive

Correct sentences:

- 1) The printers ARE SERVICED every month.
- 2) The new WMS IS BEING IMPLEMENTED at the moment.
